

IQARUS DELIVERS INTEROPERABLE MEDICAL CAPABILITIES FOR MILITARY CLIENTS GLOBALLY

RELEVANT PAST PERFORMANCE

Iqarus has a proven record of delivering resilient, commercially delivered military medical capabilities, successfully replacing and augmenting government-provided services in multiple operational theatres:

Kosovo R2B: Established and continue to operate the first commercial Role 2 Basic hospital for NATO in Pristina since January 2018, supporting 5,000+ multinational personnel deployed on the KFOR mission. Services include dental, surgical, ICU, laboratory, radiology, and ground ambulance. The facility replaced the previous German Role 2 hospital based in Prizren, Kosovo.

Niger R2F: Designed and built a Role 2 Forward surgical facility for the Belgian Armed Forces in Maradi, supporting special forces training and advisory operations. Integrated with BELAF Role 1 to provide emergency, surgical, ICU, and radiology services in a remote environment.

Oman DCS: Deployed a Field Surgical Team replacing a UK FST deployed to Duqm, Oman in 2020/2021. The surgical capability supported UK PJHQ with independent DCS field surgical capability for a period of 9 months. Including all medical equipment, surgical equipment, medications, consumables, and support elements for a deployed element.

Mali R2E: Iqarus designed, built and deployed a multi-disciplinary Role 2 Enhanced field hospital, for the European Union Training Mission under the MPCC arm of EEAS, replacing the German Bundeswehr Field Hospital deployed in Koulikoro, Mali in 2020. 50+ personnel, DCS, ICU, blood incl frozen blood, radiology, isolation, MEPT-armoured, enhanced laboratory and FHPO services.

Mali AME Team, Gao: Delivered rotary-wing aeromedical evacuation capability from 2021-2023 in direct support of the German Bundeswehr, providing frontline response and critical emergency transport with EU-certified Flight Doctor and Paramedics.

A Naval partner: Iqarus surge deployed an EU-certified surgeon at short notice, supporting the field deployment of a naval vessel, enhancing the surgical capability with a lead surgeon, and enabling deployment to continue without interruption, integrating into the military medical team.

DCS SWAF, Mali: Deployed a surgical team embedded within a Swedish Military Role 2 Facility in Timbuktu Mali, from 2018-2020. Provision of two surgeons, anaesthetists, and OT nurses as a combined SWAF-Iqarus capability supporting SWE, FRE forces in Mali. The facility provided rearward emergency battlefield surgery for military personnel prior to strategic evacuation from theatre. Under secondment from Iqarus to SWAF. Operating under SWAF clinical governance and fully integrated with SWAF teams on the ground.
